The funding available is £16,850 (+ £204 surplus from 2021/22) – **Total = £17,054**

We will target funds and monitor impact by:

- enhancing the PE provision for children
- setting a new standard in children's activity levels
- meeting the inclusion requirements and the value for money criteria which will be set by Ofsted.
